



## Parts of Your Land You Are Responsible For:

- -Overgrown weeds and grass -Junk Vehicles
- -Inappropriate storage of materials -Fences requiring repair

-Dilapidated Buildings -Nuisance Animals -Pet Wastes -Overgrown/Hazardous Trees -Inappropriate water drainage -Keeping your back alley tidy

# BYLAW 19-08: Maintenance Of Property and Nuisance Abatement Bylaw Property Owner: Duty to Maintain

"Sec. 5.1., No person shall cause or permit a nuisance to occur on any property owned by that person." Duty to maintain rests on owner or occupant, and shall include land or buildings, and adjoining boulevards and lanes.

#### What Land Are You Responsible For?

-Front/Side Yard -Backyard -Alley adjoining property -Adjoining Boulevard

#### What Do You Need to Do?

-Keep land maintained by cutting grass and removing weeds -Prune trees and bushes that are overgrown (Anything within

7.5 meters from any roadway must be under 3ft)

-Repair fences that are hazardous or falling down

-Keep adjoining alleyway and sidewalk clear of debris, grass, weeds, garbage, etc.

-Remove all garbage, lawn clippings, animal feces, and anything else that may be considered waste from the property within a timely manner

### Why?

- -To provide a safe and clean environment within the community
- -To prevent rodent infestation within the neighbourhood
- -To allow enjoyment for all members of the community

# Maintenance: Safety Considerations

Some safety concerns regarding property maintenance include, but aren't limted to:

-Sightline: No obstructions higher than 3ft closer than 7.5 meters from any roadway -Bulk storage of materials may cause rodent infestation

-Obstructing sidewalks possess a risk to walking pedestrians -Dead or hazardous trees may cause obstruction to traffic or pedestrians, and possess a threat during heavy winds, etc.
